The Wonder of Language: connecting parents, babies and young children through books

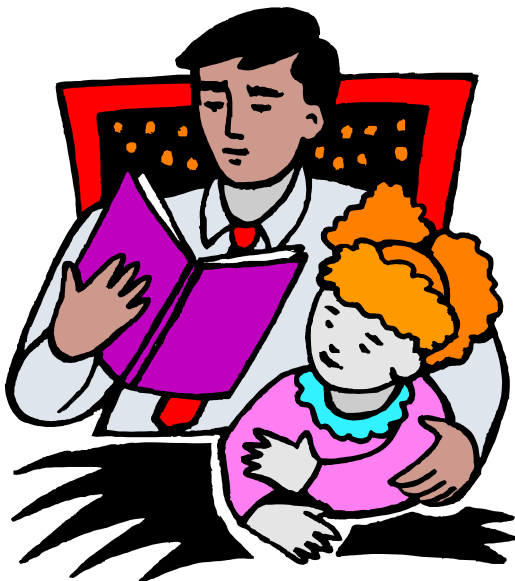
